Rural evangelism has its own set of challenges, but when you couple

that with the coronavirus pandemic it might seem a great challenge to ensure the spiritual well-being of the church. Despite all that has happened, the Lord's church at Sipaba has remained faithful, and has been growing in number as well. Although COVID-19 prevented us from meeting in person for over 8 weeks, it seems like the church came out stronger on the other side. Recently the church has been averaging over 90 in attendance up from the 60 average before coronavirus. Over the past weeks, the church has seen 17 individuals give their lives to the Lord in baptism. Members have been busy inviting both family and friends to come to church services. They have also been active in the community from assisting at funerals, and donating food items to the poor in their village from the church fund. The drive and the initiative that the church members have demonstrated is refreshing and has been a constant source of encouragement for us. It is a testimony of God at work through his people. We would like to ask you to say a special prayer for the Sipaba church of Christ to not grow weary but to grow spiritually.

Over 700 Families Assisted

Your generosity and partnership saw us assist over 700 families with at least a 10kg bag of mealie meal. Messages of gratitude have been outpouring from many church leaders for this much needed encouragement in a time where the COVID-19 pandemic has worsened an already struggling economy. We are learning that some are in fact going to bed without food, so your assistance has indeed alleviated hardships many families were facing.

A bag of mealie meal can feed a small family for weeks while it will last several days for a large family. With it, families make the staple food of Zimbabwe known as "sadza/isitshwala." Some have said it looks like mashed potatoes but thicker. It is basically milled super-refined corn that is cooked and thickened with water. Since it is purely starch, it is often eaten with something else to make it a balanced and nutritious meal.





With the funds raised we managed to assist those of the household of faith (Gal. 6:10), and over 450 families across the churches of Christ in Bulawayo were helped. One of the preachers wrote to us and said, "We really appreciated the gift. The brethren were really excited to receive the mealie meal. It's unfortunate the smiles were hidden under the masks. Thank you thank you may God bless your effort in spreading His word."

Additionally, we were also able extend the food aid not only to the Sipaba church of Christ, but also to over 250 households in the community of Sipaba and the neighbouring village of Mlomoliwoto. We were honoured by the presence of the village heads and the elected councillor of the ward who commended the efforts of assisting the community. The

distribution awarded us the opportunity to reach the community with not just the food relief, but more importantly with the word of God. The COVID-19 Relief effort has encouraged many, and reminded them that even in hard times God has not forgotten them. Thank you all so much for helping, and know that your donations have strengthened His church and helped spread the good news.

Sharing Christ In The Age of COVID-19

Just like everyone across the globe, we too had to adjust and work around the challenges posed by the coronavirus pandemic. In order to contain the disease, the Zimbabwean government restricted gatherings including church meetings. The restrictions lasted a little over 2 months, but on the 12th of June the government

permitted church meetings to take place again under the conditions that they follow guidelines offered by the ministry of health. The current guidelines stipulate that everyone wear a face mask, all who attend are to be sanitised, and gatherings must not exceed more than 50 people. We thank God that we are now finally meeting in person.

During the two months when we could not meet in person, we turned to social media in order to spread the good news to our congregants and others who would hear it. Nkosi and William found themselves preaching to their cameras and smartphones, but all of this was to keep the young church fed with the word of God. Short devotionals were uploaded on WhatsApp each Sunday and Wednesday for the Sipaba church of Christ and some were put on Facebook as well.



We also sent out short lesson outlines so that when members gathered on Sundays at their homes without us, they could follow the lesson along with the video and audio devotionals. We are grateful for the technology that allowed us to keep on sharing Christ in the age of coronavirus.
