A surveyor visited our church stand, and was able to detect water beneath this rocky terrain. We were so overjoyed to learn that there is water beneath the church stand going as deep as 100 meters! Now that we know we have water, what is left is to begin the drilling process and install a bush pump. We are asking for you prayers with this project. This well will not only benefit the church, but the community as well. The community will be allowed to fetch water from the pump, but as they do so there will be someone on the church ground sharing the Living Water with them (John 4:14). The church also plans to use the water to begin their gardening projects.

WHEELS FOR THE ZM TEAM

We were both humbled and pleasantly surprised when we found out that the Southwest church of Christ, our overseeing congregation, had raised \$25, 000.00 for ZM to purchase a work vehicle. We had made a plea after realizing that our current vehicles were no longer able to accommodate our current teammates. Coupled with our anticipation of future teams coming from the US, we quickly realized we would not have nearly enough room for everyone in our current vehicles, hence the plea for assistance in acquiring a van for work purposes. Our target was just \$12, 000.00 - \$15, 000.00, and Southwest far surpassed our hopes with their generosity! With these funds, coupled with \$8,000 from Stantonville church of Christ, we will be able to buy another small vehicle in addition to the van. We have already purchased a small, fuel saver (Honda Fit), and in the not so distance future we will be getting the blue van to your right. God is good indeed, and He is our provider (Philippians 4:19).
