ASBM falls under

We hope to revive a local heart of missions and provide training in efforts to groom more mission minded followers of Christ, both across Zimbabwe and beyond.

Our First Installation & and Unveiling of a **Borehole**

After hitting dry holes with our drilling, we decided to make one last effort to confirm that there was not water in Stpaba. Though the drilling deemed the wells dry, people were telling us that they were seeing water in the holes. That is when wedecided to do a capacity test, and the results were what we had hoped to hear. They told us that the evidence of water during a non-rainy season was a pretty good indicator that this was an okay place to install a borehole pump. God answered our prayers. The pump was installed on 8 September, and the borehole officially unveiled to the public on 9 September.
