Vehicle

Transportation is essential!

Living an hour from the school grounds, for the time being, makes having a vehicle essential to our ministry. We are extremely grateful for our hosts allowing us to use one of their vehicles for the time being. We cannot thank them enough! It did, however, die on us after only 2 days use. We are still able to find some times to borrow their other vehicle, but we hate to be a bother as we know they need to use it as well.

In searching for a vehicle we hope to find one suitable for the rural areas where our work will largely take place. Durability and reliability are important. We hope to find one that will last not a year or two, but several. Taking these things into consideration, we have set a goal of \$12,000 or more for such a vehicle.
